n October 14, 2020, Jobe and Ashley Jackson welcomed a new baby boy into the family and JW Jackson got a new baby brother. (See the birth announcement on page 16.) We love to welcome new children into our church family, and celebrate the joy they bring.

JW and Pearce are the seventh generation of their family to be part of FPC San Antonio. They are descendants of the Newton family, who were founding members of the congregation. Samuel Newton, Pearce's and JW's ancestor, was one of the first elders of First Presbyterian Church of San Antonio (installed 1851).

I mention Pearce's birth because it has prompted new hope and a new perspective. In the year 2020, a year of unexpected trial, unrest and tribulation, the Lord blessed the Jackson family, and the First Presbyterian Church family with a reminder of His faithfulness.

Seven generations ago, God established First Presbyterian Church to establish a "foothold of the gospel in San Antonio." And, for seven generations, God has upheld that purpose. From generation to generation, the Lord has carried First Presbyterian Church through wars, depressions and even pandemics. And now, in spite of a health crisis, economic recession, social upheaval and political turmoil, God continues to remind us of his providential care. For seven generations, God has gathered, guided, fed and guarded his people so that we can Love Jesus Christ, Love One Another and Love the City.

When Louis Zbinden first arrived in San Antonio in 1971, a reporter asked him why he had moved his family all the way from North Carolina to lead a struggling downtown church in Texas. He answered, "Because there are still people in San Antonio, and God still loves them."

Even after 174 years, the Lord is reminding us that San Antonio still needs First Presbyterian Church. 2020 was a year of fear and division. 2021 will be the year for us to draw people together in the hope of Jesus Christ. 2020 was the year of isolation, distancing and separation. 2021 will be a year to bring the church and our people back together. 2020 was the year of health, economic, and social crisis. 2021 will be the year for FPC to be the hands and feet of Christ to people who have suffered these calamities.

God has given each one of us resources for this moment. He has made us by his grace, by his faith and by his love. He has equipped us with spiritual gifts, heartfelt passions, abilities, personalities, and experiences. As the Apostle Paul wrote, "We are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them." (Ephesians 2:10)

The Lord also brought us together, as a church, for this moment. Even though 2020 took all of us by surprise, the Lord was not surprised. From time eternal God knew what was going to happen, and members, pastors, officers, teachers, volunteers, staff—

the Lord brought together, his people, "for such a time as this." And he didn't make any mistakes. There were no accidents. The Lord loves you, he made you and we are supposed to be here together.

No one can argue that 2020 took us by surprise. But we are going to be ready for 2021. This is our moment and we are going to take the lessons that we learned in 2020 and apply them to 2021. God has given us the vision, the means, the tools, the talent, and the people. We need every family in the church to share the blessings God has entrusted to our care.

Right now, each one of us needs to rise to this moment. I am asking each one of you to rise to this moment, knowing that our Lord has placed us here For Such a Time as This. Over the next few days, you will receive information about our Stewardship campaign for 2021. 2021 will our 175th anniversary of ministry in San Antonio. Whether you represent the seventh generation, or you are the first in your family to be part of FPC, you are important. God has a design for you. He has a plan and purpose for your life. He has a position for you on his team and a place for you at his table. The Lord made you for this moment by his Grace, by his Faith and by his Love.



A Safe Celebration of Midday Noels

are once excited to offer Midday Noels concerts December, our holiday 'gift to the city' with a variety of creative musical offerings. As you might imagine, accessibility and safety are two of our highest priorities as we make plans for our concerts this year. In addition to inperson attendance, all three concerts will be streamed live at fpcsanantonio.org/ noels and will be available for viewing on our Youtube.com channel after the concert. Utilizing our 'state of the art' livestreaming equipment, you will be able to see and hear all the performances with high quality video and audio.

For those that choose to attend in-person, we will have limited distanced seating available in our sanctuary similar to that utilized during worship on Sunday mornings. Additional measures such as increased sanitation and air-purification will be employed before and during the concerts. We will ask everyone to wear a mask when entering and exiting the building, as well as during the concert.

All our concerts will be free and open

to the public. In an effort to safely manage the capacity of our facility, we will be using a free on-line reservation system for in-person attendance. We ask that you reserve a free ticket by visiting fpcsanantonio.org/noels. In a few quick and easy steps, you will be able to either print your ticket or save it to your smart phone. You can reserve up to 2 tickets per person - parties of 4 or more can contact Brittanie Salazar at 210-271-2730 for group tickets. The concerts will begin at 12 Noon and doors will open at 11:30 AM. Entry to the concerts will be through the Alamo Street Sanctuary doors. Those needing additional assistance should use the Avenue E entrance. When you arrive to the sanctuary, we will briefly scan your free ticket as an usher takes you to the next available seating area in the sanctuary. In order to maximize our limited seating, we will not be able to honor special requests for seating other than those that require mobility assistance. At the end of the concert, the usher will dismiss the audience by row beginning with the back of the sanctuary and moving forward. We ask that you do not congregate in public areas while you are in the facility to ensure the safety of all our guests.

Following the concert, we will be offering 'Grab and Go' lunches (\$5), available on the sidewalk just outside our sanctuary doors. Due to the safety considerations of serving a hot lunch to large crowds, we will not be offering a seated lunch option this year in Westminster Hall. Rest assured that we will look forward to bringing that back in future years.

I'm really excited about our concert line-up this year. Here is just a brief description of the programs you can look forward to:

Thursday, December 3 "Shimmering Songs and Sparkling Singing"

Our FPC Chamber Singers present four beautiful choral pieces of the season, interspersed with captivating vocal solos that span diverse genres including opera and popular song.


Thursday, December 10 "Sound the Trumpet!"

Local Mission Update: Christian Assistance Ministries (CAM)


hroughout this COVID-19 period. CAM remained open to share the love of Christ providing immediate assistance and encouragement to people in crisis. We have adapted to this "new normal" moving operations outside and prioritizing the unsheltered homeless. assistance financial prescriptions and food. CAM has never been more needed. We are blessed to meet the needs of people, often at 4 to 5 times the service levels before COVID-19.



This year CAM has provided over \$100,000 in rental assistance; 5,000 lunches per month;

weekly clothing (including new hygiene, underwear and socks); groceries (monthly for those not homeless and every two weeks for those without a car); financial assistance for utilities. recovery, and prescriptions; free mail service; monthly outdoor clothing pantry (3rd Saturday of each month); porta potties, hand washing stations, drinking water, and showers. Our NW location resumed normal hours on October 1st and is open Tuesday through Thursday. We have done all of this without our regular, hundreds of volunteers and with new COVID safety protocol.

This year, CAM will likely serve over 70,000 people, 20,000 more than usual. We are seeing a higher rate of homeless clients (about 50% versus 25% historically). We have been blessed by relationships with those we serve who (of course) know these are hard times and are so grateful to be able to count on us daily, like "MD" who helps us clean up the campus and brings fresh vegetables from his small garden. Other clients offer helpful advice and suggest better processes to be more helpful to those we serve. Folks like Miranda, Joe or Henry help keep others in line and keep



the peace with us. We even hired security with an initial concern this might cause some problems; and yet, we see our clients so grateful for him as an additional blessing and help to them. Our staff experience many "God Bless you's" and smiles that lift us up from our worries

We have been blessed by support from thousands of individuals, many churches, and increased coordination with other city ministry partners. We have made our facilities available to other partners to serve downtown. For example, on October 10, we coordinated with Faith Based Institute and FPC to host Loaves and Fishes.

LOVING THE WORLD

Global Mission Update: Haiti

aiti is a country of 11 million people located on the Eastern side of the Island of Hispaniola which it shares with the Dominican Republic. It achieved independence from France in 1804, making it the second oldest independent country in the Americas. The name Haiti is derived from a French word denoting mountains or "heights",



which refers to mountainous character of the landscape. The highest point on the island is Pic La Selle which stands at 8,793 ft, slightly higher than the tallest peak in Texas, Guadalupe, at 8,750 ft.

In the early 20th century, the United States occupied Haiti from 1915-1934, and during this time the Haitian constitution was penned by future President, Franklin D. Roosevelt. After the departure of U.S. Marines, the country has experienced either political turmoil or authoritarian rule for much of the past 80 years. The current President, Jovenel Moise was elected in 2017, and his term has been



marked by periods of social unrest. Currently, Haiti is classified as High Risk – Do Not Travel by the U.S. State Department.

As it often is in the face of **adversity,** the proclamation of the Gospel of Jesus Christ thrives. Our mission partner is the Rev. Octavius Delfils of the Reformed Presbyterian Church of Haiti (or in French - Eglise Presbytérienne Réformée). A 2007 graduate of Greenville Presbyterian Theological Seminary, he leads a congregation in the Delmas section of Port-au-Prince. His congregation meets in a large tent located on the property of the Adoration Christian Centre.





a school operated by Word and Deed, a mission agency associated with Christian Reformed congregations in the United States and Canada.

Recently we received an outline of the goals for the ministry for 2021. They include:

- Proclaim the gospel of God's sovereign salvation through the work of Christ and the operation of the Holy Spirit in all its fullness in the church and around Port-au-Prince, not only in word but also being accompanied by deeds of love to God and man which must flow from it.
- Warn the unbelieving of eternal punishment and pray by God's grace that they understand the gospel, repent, believe, and live redeemed lives.
- Help establish an indigenous presbytery in Haiti
 to provide overseeing, fellowship, discipleship and
 instruction, and to make the gospel known in the
 culture.
- Train and ordain elders and deacons.
- Teach a solid program in Reformed theology.
- Translate two reformed books from English into French or Creole and publish them.
- Train children and youth in VBS, clubs and conferences.
- Train and encourage people to read the Bible, live a faithful Christian life and be involved in the ministry of the church.


THANKSGIVING DEVOTION


