More than a Motto: Loving Christ. Loving One Another. Loving the City.

PART 2: LOVING ONE ANOTHER

Just a few days ago, our covenant partners Ronald and Karen Herrmann were honored by the UT Health and Science Center for establishing a program to train and provide support for caregivers. The “Caring for the Caregiver” program will become part of the School of Nursing and will provide training for non-professional, unpaid caregivers (family members and friends) who step into the lives of the people they love, to care for them when they have extended physical or memory issues.

This program is being established with both a loving heart and clear eyes. Ron and Karen recognize that formal professional treatment is not enough to meet the daily needs of families and communities dealing with long-term issues. Friends, family members and caring neighbors need to get involved and those “blessed amateurs” need to be equipped to deliver the help and compassion people deserve.

As I learned more about this program and the needs it addresses, I thought about the second element of our church motto: “Loving One Another.” “Loving One Another” is a call to pay attention to the relationships we have within our Church family. In the gospel of John, chapter 13:34-35, Jesus said,

“A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another. By this all people will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another.”

Loving One Another is about building community as God’s Family of

Faith. This means two things.

First, it means building better relationships. Because we have a new identity with God through Jesus Christ, we have a new relationship with one another. As we get closer to Christ, we should also be getting closer to one another.

Think about it this way. For the next four months of Saturdays, college football fans will get together in stadiums, in homes and in restaurants to paint their faces, yell, cheer and go bananas for their teams. But, when the game is over they will break up and go their own ways. They have a Saturday relationship.

Sadly, this is often true of Christians. We get together one day a week and we go bananas (in a very Presbyterian way). But, what happens to that Sunday relationship on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday?

The Lord wants us to have more than a Sunday relationship with one another. He wants us to love one another like he loved us. He wants us to move beyond civility to friendship—beyond affiliation to love.

The Lord wants us to get involved in one another’s lives beyond Sundays. Get involved in the life of a teenager, or a homebound person you have been meaning to visit. Get involved in the life of that stressed-out mom or dad, or that single parent with the crying baby sitting at the other end of your pew.

We need to play together as well as pray together. We can do that informally, one on one, or we can do it formally through small groups. The point is that God wants us together in “fellowship,” and “fellowship” is

the church word for “friendship.” We want everyone to be connected in some sort of small group community that commits to friendship with one another.

Second, Christ wants us to know one another better so that we can care for one another better. We don't always know what people need, but when we get involved in their lives, God puts us in position to help people when a need arises or their lives break down.

The sad truth is that many members of our church family fall through the cracks at some of the most critical moments of their lives. Our church is growing, and as we continue to grow, we have to ask ourselves some important questions. *How can we love more people? How can we do it better?* Before we get too big, we need to build an infrastructure of fellowship and caring that will serve the needs of our congregation as we grow.

Ron and Karen's vision for care givers in the community gives us a push in the right direction. We need to get more people involved, and we need to provide training.

We need to reshape the culture of care in our congregation. Caring for one another is not solely the job of the deacons or the clergy. It is the calling of every covenant partner. How can we get more people involved and provide the training we need so that we can *Love One Another* better?

A PARTNERSHIP CELEBRATION



First Presbyterian Church sponsored its first Hope Sunday in March of 2013. Hope Sunday was the beginning of FPC's partnership with World Vision in Malawi in the Mutendere Area Development Project (ADP). At this time, hundreds of children were sponsored, which extended into care for the entire community in a variety of ways as relationships were formed.

Over the six years that FPC has been participating through sponsorship in the Mutendere ADP much has taken place, and we are able to celebrate with World Vision Malawi that the ADP is now self-sustaining. A recent report from World Vision Malawi has provided powerful evidence of the effect FPC's partnership and ultimately God's provision have had. A few highlights from the report are:

- Almost every person in the area has access to clean water due to 19 new boreholes and one repaired water point.
- Boys and girls have better protection and provision for health and nutrition concerns, as 286 health care promoters were trained and grain banks were built.
- There has been an increase in school enrollment as a result of over 40 new schools and the distribution of over 2,300 desks, 5,000 textbooks, and other school supplies.
- Around 30 Bible clubs were established in schools, for children to learn about and grow in their relationship with Christ.

In addition to the work that has been made possible through sponsorships at FPC, we celebrate the two opportunities FPC Covenant Partners were able to take to visit the children in Mutendere. These visits left lasting impressions on the families who were able to meet their sponsors and impacted the hearts of those who were able to visit and hear stories from the trips.

As the Mutendere ADP closes, we are thrilled to be able to celebrate this partnership that has made a lasting, holistic change in the lives of our brothers and sisters in Malawi. The current 125 active sponsors from FPC will be given the opportunity to sponsor a new child in Malawi as a new ADP is working toward transformation. We look forward to seeing how the Lord uses this partnership to extend into new communities, and how the Gospel continues to bear fruit in the lives of the families in Malawi.

Please continue to pray for the Mutendere ADP as World Vision works in the community to develop a sustainable plan for the future, and as the community
