Redeeming the Crisis

ack in April, one of our elders, David West, challenged the leadership of our church with a question. In an email he wrote:

When our children and grandchildren ask "what did you do in the COVID-19 war, Daddy," I want all of the members of FPC to have a ready answer.

That one question sparked a lot of conversation.

The needs following this crisis are going to be enormous, but they are not going to be bigger than God. The Lord has trusted this church with incredible resources for such a time as this.

In good Presbyterian fashion, the Session responded to David's question by putting together a task force to talk and pray about how we would address both the current crisis and its aftermath. The task force would lead our congregation in both our short term and long term community response to this pandemic. We call the effort "REDEEMING THE CRISIS."

"REDEEMING THE CRISIS" (RTC) and the task force that leads it will be focused on meeting both immediate needs and addressing long-term damage from COVID-19.

This is not an effort to do something on our own, but rather to work strategically and collaboratively with our mission partners to find the places where the best efforts can be applied. Much of what we do with RTC will build on well-established efforts. RTC will also break new ground, addressing long-term needs created by the damage of the disease and the shut-down. We will be addressing issues related to mental illness, financial health, the impact on children in our community, the brokenness of families and marriages all while pursuing opportunities to move forward with the gospel by seeking out opportunities for church planting and kingdom growth.

RTC is not just an effort to give away money or to supply band-aids. This pandemic is a generational crisis and we are looking at this as a generational response. South African Archbishop Desmond Tutu once said "Rather than just pulling people out of the river, we need

to go up stream and find out why they keep falling into the river in the first place."

David's question is a question for the church, but it is also personal. How is God calling *me* to *Love Christ, Love One Another, and Love the City* in this crisis?

One of our first steps in **REDEEMING THE CRISIS** is to gather information. First, we will gather information about needs. We will be asking you to complete a survey designed to gather information on you, your family, your contacts and your network. We are all feeling the weight of this pandemic and we want to listen to and learn one another's needs. As a church, we need to bring together the concerns, the fears, the opportunities and the stories we are hearing from our neighbors and our neighborhoods. We want to take the temperature and check the health of both our community and our own church family.

Second, we will gather information about *gifts*. We are going to inventory our congregation to assess the skills, resources, relationships, connections and spiritual gifts we can bring to bear for the sake of our community. Jesus said,

¹³ Go and learn what this means: 'I desire mercy, and not sacrifice." (Matthew 9:13)

When it comes to the mission of God's Kingdom, the Lord wants us not only to give our

resources (our sacrifices), He wants us personally involved in his work (mercy). We have already given emergency funds to many of our mission partners to help deal with some of the most immediate needs in San Antonio, particularly the needs of our homeless neighbors and those who have lost work. The Spiritual gift survey takes us to the next step, the step of personal investment, and will help us to learn how the Lord has designed and gifted each of us to show His mercy in this moment fpcsanantonio.org/gifts-survey.

You will be hearing a lot more about **REDEEMING THE CRISIS** from the RTC task force chair Teresa McCaleb and her team in the weeks to come. The Lord is summoning us to REACH OUT to our city, to REACH IN to one another and to **REACH UP** to the Lord Jesus Christ in Prayer and Worship. How has he equipped us to deal with the necessities of this specific moment? How has God prepared you through your own talents, experiences and passions to redeem this crisis? And when future generations ask, "what did you do in the COVID-19 war," how will we answer?

MISSION SOUTH COVID RELIEF

riends, I am pleased to share some good news with you from the Mission South Task Force. Given the unique and difficult circumstances that our brothers and sisters of South Texas and Mexico have faced in recent months due to COVID-19, our team participated in delivering financial help to those in need. A total of \$14,500 has been delivered to churches, pastors, families and ministries. In this brief report, I will share stories from three partners whose efforts made this possible.

Rev. Hector Reynoso is the pastor of Genesis Presbyterian Church in Mercedes, Texas. His father was a Presbyterian pastor and for many years taught at the Presbyterian Seminary in Mexico City. He met his wife Carmen, a native of Puerto Rico, when they were neighbors in Houston as young adults. They have been ministering in the Rio Grande Valley for over 20 years. In 2012 their church disaffiliated from the PCUSA and lost everything. Hector has many friends in ministry on both sides of the border. He gave us names of churches and pastors in South Texas and Mexico who were in need. We have been blessed to get to know Hector, Carmen, and their contacts; and we look forward to

serving together even as they break ground in 2021 for their new building.

Pastor Edgar González Terán is a Presbyterian minister in Mexico City, and has been serving churches throughout Mexico for over 30 years. He and his wife are delivering support to more than 10 families, many of whom have experienced the death of a family member due to COVID-19.

Sister Elma Fonseca, founder director of CASA HOGAR MAMi in Revnosa, Mexico, has been feeding and housing the poorest of the poor in northern Mexico since the early 1990's. In 2000, with her own funds, she founded a home for street children which now includes a school, parents day out, and parent education program. She rents a small house in Hidalgo, Texas and travels daily across the border to deliver supplies. The custom agents on both sides know her well and allow her to deliver help to those in need. This is most unusual, as the border is officially closed and most of our ministry partners say that they cannot cross.

Since the Spring, the children have not been living in the home and instead are staying with relatives. 52 families come pick up food baskets every week. Since the hurricane hit, a meal and food basket are delivered each week to 150 families living in the garbage dump. The AMO program is embraced by the CASA MAMi teachers and will continue this fall as packets of homework will be sent home and returned every week. Sister Elma is a valuable partner not only because of her heart for the Lord and his suffering children but because of her history, ability to cross the border, and outstanding reputation in the RGV and northern Mexico.

We praise God that He has allowed us to share in His work by showing mercy and love in Jesus' name. The people we have met are humble and grateful. God bless them!



Yucatan Peninsula Mission

ucatan Peninsula Mission (YPM) has been advancing Redemptive Restoration in the Yucatan since the 1960's. First Pres has been in partnership with YPM for over 25 years. Mission teams have built churches, hospitals and staffed medical clinics. In 2017 Instituto YPM opened, offering University degrees in business administration, education and law. Shortly thereafter, an online component was added. Of particular note, unlike many "degree" programs offered in Mexico, iYPM graduates receive degrees that are recognized by the Federal Secretary of Education, and thus officially "licensed" and valid for employment across Mexico.

Within the year, the school will be adding an officially licensed Theology degree. This will differentiate iYPM from other Presbyterian/ Protestant seminaries whose degrees are only accepted within Churches. The vision is that future Pastors who receive their education at iYPM will have degrees accepted for varieties of employment. In Mexico the majority of Pastors are compensated less than \$3,000 per year, so having additional sources of income is vital to their livelihood.

COVID-19

Covid-19 is having a devasting impact on the people around the YPM base camp in Leona







Vicario. As we all know, accurate counts of Covid-19 cases and deaths are elusive. But best estimates are that Mexico trails only Brazil and the United States in cases and deaths. And Covid appears to be much more deadly in Mexico. As of mid-August, Texas has had approximately 500,000 cases and just under 9,000 deaths. In Mexico, the case count is 500,000 but with over 50,000 reported fatalities.

The impacts of Covid-19 go beyond just the medical implications. Leona Vicario is located 25 miles from Cancun and many, if not most of the people from the villages, work in the tourist industry there. With the virtual shutdown of the tourist industry, the economic impact is devastating as well.

In April, Wilian Cen, executive director of YPM approached the YPM-USA Board with a proposal to address food insecurity issues in Leona Vicario due to job losses. In response, the YPM-USA Board approached supporting Churches to underwrite the costs of this program. First Pres responded generously and granted \$20,000 toward this relief effort. (It is worth noting that this was part of a much larger response that included more than \$100,000 in grants above annual funding amounts to mission partners across the globe.)

The program is ongoing and continues to evolve. One element has been the monthly distribution of essential provision bags, containing: 5 lbs Beans, 5 lbs Rice, 2 Bags of Pasta, 5 lbs of Maseca (corn flour), 2 liters of Bleach, Bar Soap and Detergent at a cost of about \$15. The distributions have occurred at the YPM base camp and at 7 different congregations in and around Leona Vicario. Included in the distributions have been 60 Pastors in the Presbytery of Northern Quintana Roo as well as 30 workers associated with YPM and the school. Cooked meals were also distributed at the YPM Base every day for two weeks beginning on 29 June, to people from the villages.

Speaking of iYPM, the school has continued to operate online throughout the crisis. Sadly, the virus has hit the school community hard and two students have died.

Living Waters - Clean Waters Installation

As many of you may know, FPC has been working diligently to install a water purification system next door to the school. A team from FPC was in Leona Vicario in February and worked on the construction of building that will house the system. The original plan was to install the system in May but was postponed due to the impacts of the virus.

FPC is working with the in-country Living Waters Yucatan












Network to have the system installed using local resources rather than our team from FPC. While not the standard model for system installations, the important thing is to provide clean water, so our hope is to have the system operational by the end of the year.

Prayers Needed

Please pray for safety, stamina and encouragement for Wilian and his wife Erly as they continue to work on the frontlines during this time of danger. We are fortunate to have such dedicated Christ-honoring partners working in the Yucatan. And we thank the FPC community that has been so very generous toward this fruitful Mission over the years.
