The Zbinden Legacy Forum honors Rev. Dr. Louis Zbinden, former senior pastor of FPC. The forum brings expert theologians to FPC on a periodic basis.

Dr. Tom Gibbs became the sixth President of Covenant Theological Seminary in St. Louis, Missouri in July 2021 after serving as a pastor for 24 years. Previously, Dr. Gibbs served as the Senior Pastor of Redeemer Presbyterian Church in San Antonio, Texas, the church he planted and pastored for 19 years. Before planting Redeemer, he also planted a Reformed University Fellowship (RUF) campus ministry at Baylor University and had served as a youth director in Birmingham, Alabama.

Dr. Gibbs brings a commitment to organizational leadership and church planting to his experience in ministry. In addition to planting Redeemer Presbyterian Church and Baylor RUF, he oversaw numerous church plants through his role as the chairman of the Southwest Church Planting Network, a network encompassing more than 60 churches across four states. He also served as a church planting assessment director for Mission to North America, the Presbyterian Church in America's church-planting agency, and founded and led Reach South Texas, an organization focused on strategic church planting in South Texas.

He has degrees from Auburn University (BChE) and Covenant Seminary (MDiv, DMin). He and his wife Tara have four children: Anna Catherine, Thomas, Lucy and Caroline.

# Excerpts from "How to Start Fasting," from *Habits of Grace* by David Mathis

Fasting is hard. It sounds much easier in concept than it proves to be in practice. It can be surprising how on-edge we feel when we miss a meal. Many an idealistic

new faster has decided to miss a meal and only found that his belly drove him to make up for it long before the next mealtime came.

Fasting sounds so simple, and yet the world, our flesh, and the Devil conspire to introduce all sorts of complications that keep it from happening. In view of helping you start down the slow path to good fasting, here are six simple pieces of advice. These suggestions might seem pedantic, but my hope is that such basic counsel can serve those who are new at fasting or have never seriously tried it.

#### 1. Start Small

Don't go from no fasting to attempting a weeklong. Start with one meal; maybe fast one meal a week for several weeks. Then try two meals, and work your way up to a daylong fast. Perhaps eventually try a two-day juice fast. A juice fast means abstaining from all food and beverage, except for juice and water.

#### 2. Plan What You'll Do Instead of Eating

Fasting isn't merely an act of self-deprivation, but a spiritual discipline for seeking more of God's fullness. Which means we should have a plan for what positive pursuit to undertake in the time it normally takes to eat. One significant part of fasting is the time it creates for prayer and meditation on God's word.

Before diving headlong into a fast, craft a simple plan. Connect it to your purpose for the fast. Each fast should have a specific spiritual purpose. Identify what that is and design a focus to replace your eating time.

#### 3. Consider How It Will Affect Others

Fasting is no license to be unloving. It would be sad to lack concern and care for others around us because of this expression of heightened focus on God. Love for God and for neighbor go together. Good fasting mingles horizontal concern with the vertical.

#### 4. Try Different Kinds of Fasting

The typical form of fasting is personal, private, and partial, but we find a variety of forms in the Bible: personal and communal, private and public, congregational and national, regular and occasional, absolute and partial. In particular, consider fasting together with your family, small group, or church.


#### 5. Fast from Something Other than Food

Fasting from food is not necessarily for everyone. Some health conditions keep even the most devout from the traditional course. However, fasting is not limited to abstaining from food, as we saw from Martyn Lloyd-Jones: "Fasting should really be made to include abstinence from anything which is legitimate in and of itself for the sake of some special spiritual purpose."

If the better part of wisdom for you, in your health condition, is not to go without food, consider fasting from television, computer, social media, or some other regular enjoyment that would bend your heart toward greater enjoyment of Jesus.

#### 6. Don't Think of White Elephants

When your empty stomach starts to growl and begins sending your brain every "feed me" signal it can, don't be content to let your mind dwell on the fact that you haven't eaten. If you make it through with an iron will that says no to your stomach but doesn't turn your mind's eye

# 2022 Update

# **Benevolence Oversight Committee**

First Presbyterian Church has been blessed with a rich heritage of Ministry Partnership that the Lord has worked through to transform lives and advance the gospel in San Antonio and among the nations. Most of our benevolences are now funded through the Local and Global Missions Committees. The focus and priorities for the Benevolence Oversight Committee is and has been providing stop-gaps, emergency funds, first-time requests that can later move to Local and Global Partnerships, unique gifts (i.e. Persian translations and Spanish Bibles), capital expenditures, capital gifts, etc.

In December, the Benevolence Oversight Committee met to continue this work of stewarding resources for ministry in several partnerships. Gifts totaling \$155,000 were approved to support the following:

- \$5,000 to support long-time Global Mission Partners and former First Presbyterian Church members, George and Anne Harper, as they work to reduce their mortgage in preparation for retirement from being full-time missionaries for most of their adult lives.
- \$5,000 for the current Morningside Ministries capital campaign to build stand-alone cottages for elder care.
- \$5,000 to fund a designated American professor to teach one course at the seminary program in Warsaw, Poland.
- \$10,000 to the Outreach Foundation, a designated Global Mission Partner of ECO, to support their work globally and especially with the church in Iraq.
- \$10,000 to Frontier Fellowship, another designated Global Mission Partner of ECO, as they empower believers to take the gospel to places where it is not yet known.
- \$10,000 to PARS Theological Centre to assist their work in translating Christian theology and living resources into the Persian language, to be used, in part, by the leaders of the underground church in Iran who PARS is training.

- \$10,000 was given to STCH Ministries to support their work in Christian counseling in San Antonio. This is a much needed resource, especially coming out of the pandemic, and we are thankful for the work they do in our city and on our FPC Campus. Please know that STCH is available on campus for any Covenant Partners, family member or friends who are in need of Christian counseling and that their services are offered free of charge.
- In response to the shooting in 2022, the Session of FPC directed \$150,000 to Benevolence Oversight to be allocated to Christian ministries serving Uvalde. Earlier in the year, the Committee sent \$50,000 to Youth For Christ Uvalde. In December, the Committee sent \$50,000 to Young Life and \$50,000 to the Fellowship of Christian Athletes as they work to hire staff and grow their ministries in Uvalde. It is truly a blessing to see how these ministries want to work together and complement one another as they pour into the Uvalde community. The Committee will be receiving regular updates from these three ministries to confirm how these ministries are progressing and how we can all pray for them going forward.

The Benevolence Oversight Committee is thankful for the opportunity to empower the work of these ministry partners through these gifts. In addition, our FPC Family is encouraged to continue praying for these various ministries and that the Lord will work through these resources as they are stewarded for His glory.


