† **PRAYER OF ADORATION**

WELCOME AND GREETINGS

(Please move down your pew towards the center aisle to make room for others still entering the worship service. Thank you for your cooperation.)

CALL TO CONFESSION | *adapted from the Declaration of Faith*

Leader: In the death of Jesus Christ God’s way in the world seemed finally defeated. But death was no match for God.

People: Jesus was dead and buried but God raised him from the dead. The risen Lord appeared to his followers. They recognized him as their Master who had been crucified, transformed and yet the same person.

Leader: In his resurrection is the promise of ours. We are convinced the life God wills for each of us is stronger than the death that destroys us. The glory of that life exceeds our imagination but we know we shall be with Christ.

All: We maintain that ultimate sovereignty now belongs to Jesus Christ in every sphere of life. Jesus is Lord. He has been Lord from the beginning. He will be Lord at the end. Nothing, not even death, can separate us from the love of God in Jesus Christ our Lord.

CONFESSING OUR SIN

NN: *The Call to Confession reminds us that we are all sinners—lost and self-centered—in need of God’s mercy. The Prayer of Confession strikes a blow against self-righteousness and humbles us before God as we say what we know to be true of ourselves. It reminds us that we are not better than others and that it is only grace that makes us what we are. In it, we pray for personal sin, for the sins of our local church, our local community, our nation, and our world.*

Merciful and risen Savior, we claim to be people of the resurrection, yet we confess that far too often we do not experience resurrection power. Our prayers are anemic and our faith is shallow. We compartmentalize our lives, placing you on the sidelines of our work, family life and play. We take too much for granted and fail to thank you for the blessings of health, relationships and freedoms. We fail to be good stewards of your creation, and we become discouraged by problems, limitations and failures. Gracious God, forgive our shortsightedness and our lack of trust. Help us to see that you are at work in our lives and in the world. Inspire us to hold fast to you in faith, knowing that you are working all things for good and that because of the empty tomb, we have nothing to fear. We pray in the name of Jesus Christ, crucified and risen!

Leader: Friends, believe the good news!

People: **In Jesus Christ, we are forgiven.**

AFFIRMATION AND DEDICATION

†DECLARING OUR FAITH | The Apostles’ Creed

NN: *In the Declaration of Faith, we say what we believe using the words of Scripture or historical faith statements. Our beliefs connect us to Christians throughout history and around the world. They are what define us and set us apart as more than simply an organization or club. The Apostles’ Creed is one of the oldest and most beloved summaries of Christian faith. It was originally developed by Roman Christians as the final “test” of a new believer before Baptism. We say it as a reminder of the core beliefs we hold as a church.*

I believe in God the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth; and in Jesus Christ His only Son, our Lord; who was conceived by the Holy Ghost, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, dead, and buried; He descended into hell; the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven, and sitteth on the right hand of God the Father Almighty; from thence He shall come to judge the quick and the dead. I believe in the Holy Ghost; the holy catholic Church; the communion of saints; the forgiveness of sins; the resurrection of the body; and the life everlasting. Amen.

†GLORIA PATRI

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Ghost; as it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE AND THE LORD’S PRAYER

NN: *The Prayers of the People are prayers offered to ask God to help us, guide us, heal us, and forgive us. In them, we pray for the needs of individuals, the nation, the community, the world, and the church. In the Lord’s Prayer, we join our prayers to the words of Jesus. The Lord’s Prayer is also a model, or template, to guide us as we make our own petitions to God.*

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever. Amen.

NN: The church confesses the scriptures to be the written Word of God, witnessing to God's self-revelation. Where the Word is read and proclaimed, Jesus Christ, the Living Word, is present by the inward witness of the Holy Spirit. For this reason, the reading, hearing, preaching, and confessing of the Word are central to Christian worship.

³¹ And taking the twelve, he said to them, "See, we are going up to Jerusalem, and everything that is written about the Son of Man by the prophets will be accomplished. ³² For he will be delivered over to the Gentiles and will be mocked and shamefully treated and spit upon. ³³ And after flogging him, they will kill him, and on the third day he will rise." ³⁴ But they understood none of these things. This saying was hidden from them, and they did not grasp what was said.

SECOND SCRIPTURE READING | *Luke 24:1-12*

¹ But on the first day of the week, at early dawn, they went to the tomb, taking the spices they had prepared. ² And they found the stone rolled away from the tomb, ³ but when they went in they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. ⁴ While they were perplexed about this, behold, two men stood by them in dazzling apparel. ⁵ And as they were frightened and bowed their faces to the ground, the men said to them, "Why do you seek the living among the dead? ⁶ He is not here, but has risen. Remember how he told you, while he was still in Galilee, ⁷ that the Son of Man must be delivered into the hands of sinful men and be crucified and on the third day rise." ⁸ And they remembered his words, ⁹ and returning from the tomb they told all these things to the eleven and to all the rest. ¹⁰ Now it was Mary Magdalene and Joanna and Mary the mother of James and the other women with them who told these things to the apostles, ¹¹ but these words seemed to them an idle tale, and they did not believe them. ¹² But Peter rose and ran to the tomb; stooping and looking in, he saw the linen cloths by themselves; and he went home marveling at what had happened.

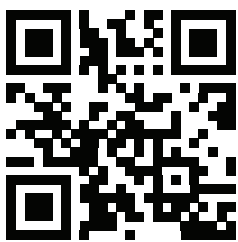
