CALL TO CONFESSION | from the Heidelberg Catechism, Q. 32.

NN: The Call to Confession reminds us that we are all sinners—lost and self-centered—in need of God's mercy. The Prayer of Confession strikes a blow against self-righteousness and humbles us before God as we say what we know to be true of ourselves. It reminds us that we are not better than others and that it is only grace that makes us what we are. 
